
INK CARTRIDGE UPDATE

BSA SERVICE AWARDS

The Boy Scouts of America recognize the Service Years of their Leaders in five year intervals usually at the District Recognition Dinner. This recognition is unique in that individuals must apply for it themselves. Also note that while it is an adult award it covers any period of time served in Scouting as both a youth and adult. Service need not be continuous. Leaders should review their service years and if it is a multiple of five (5 - 10 - 15 - 20, etc.), they should notify the Troop Committee Chair and submit an application for the award.

GOING TO CAMP?

It's that time of year to decide if you are going to Summer Camp with the other members of our Troop. We have reserved the week of Sunday July 13th to Saturday, the 19th, at Hidden Valley Scout Reservation and/or Sunday July 20th to Saturday, the 26th, at Camp Bell. Both camps are part of Griswold Scout Reservation in Gilmanton Ironworks NH. This year's cost for Hidden Valley Scout Reservation will be \$340.00, if you pay the \$50.00 non-refundable, but transferable, deposit by March 17th and pay the balance (\$290.00) by May 15th; \$360.00, if you pay the \$50.00 deposit after March 17th and pay the balance (\$310.00) by May 15th; \$380.00, if you sign-up after May 15th. This year's cost for Camp Bell will be \$365.00, if you pay the \$50.00 non-refundable, but transferable, deposit by March 17th and pay the balance (\$315.00) by May 15th; \$385.00, if you pay the \$50.00 deposit by March 17th and pay the balance (\$330.00) after May 15th; \$405.00, if you sign-up after May 15th. If you have been to Summer Camp several years and will be at least 14 years old by camp time and are looking for a different experience. How about the SPOKE or Valley Voyageur Programs? This year's cost for SPOKE or Valley Voyagers will the same as Camp Bell. If you would like to attend camp with the Troop or would like more information about camp, SPOKE or Valley Voyageur Programs, please contact Mr. Bohnwagner by Friday March 7th so we can
