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CANS AND BOTTLES

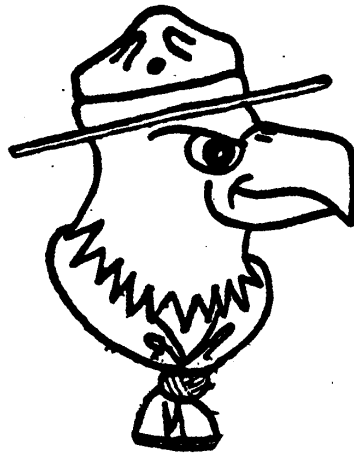

SALEM DUMP AND WAL-MART SHOW N' SELL RESULTS

On Saturday October 17th, we held a Popcorn Show N' Sell Fundraiser at the Salem Dump, raising \$675.00 in popcorn sales, meat stick sales, and donations. On Sunday October 18th, we held the last of this year's Popcorn Show N' Sell Fundraisers at Wal-Mart in Salem. We raised \$640.75. As a result, 10-percent of both fundraisers have been credited toward the Individual Scout Accounts of those who participated. The balances will be used to pay for the popcorn and meat sticks with the remainder going into our General Operating Account. On Tuesday October 20th, we held the first phase of our efforts to recruit New Scouts into our Troop. We hosted an Open House for First

The next phases of our recruitment plan are to invite them and other First and Second-Year Webelos to be our guests at our November 4th Webelos/Scout Invitational Bowling and Pizza Night at All Saints' Bowling Lanes in Haverhill followed by invitations to visit us at our Saturday November 21st Survival Campout at Camp Carpenter, our Webelos/Scout Fun Volleyball Challenge Volleyball Game on Tuesday December 8th at a location yet to be determined, and to spend the day with us on Saturday January 9th, during our January Deep-Freeze Encampment at Lone Tree Scout Reservation in Kingston NH.

TROOP RECHARTERING

The Boy Scouts of America requires that all Scout Units recharter annually. Our district, Nutfield District of Daniel Webster Council, recharts during December. This year's Recharter Date is Saturday, December 5th. At which time we will recharter active Scouts and Leaders and drop inactive ones. The cost to recharter is \$25.00 Registration and Accident Insurance Fees for each Scout and Leader; \$12.00 for Boys' Life Magazine Subscription for each family; and a \$40.00 Unit Fee. Our Sponsor, The Salem NH American Legion Ernest W. Young Post 63, will pay the \$40.00 Unit Fee. As of today, the total cost to recharter our Troop is expected to be \$955.00. It is important that we collect our 2016 Dues and popcorn profits which will be used to meet this expense. Because of the cost, it is important that we only recharter active individuals. Those individuals not planning to re-register need to contact Mr. Bohnwagner by Tuesday November 24th.

SCOUTING FOR FOOD GOOD TURN PROJECT

On Saturday, the 7th, we along with members of all the other Boy Scout Troops, Cub Scout Packs, Venture Crews, and Brownie and Girl Scout Troops, and other volunteers in Salem will distribute Scouting for Food Door Hangers to homes in Salem asking that they donate non-perishable food items to help feed the needy in town. Residents will be asked to provide their own bags or boxes in addition to donating food. The items will be picked up the following Saturday, November 14th. We will meet at the Central Fire Station on Main Street at 8:30am on November 7th for the door hanger

distribution and 9:30am on Saturday, the 14th, for item pick-up and should be done by about 2:00pm on both Saturdays. If the door hangers don't get out, the chance of collecting food goes way down. We need adults (leaders and parents) to help provide transportation. We'll need at least one driver for each group of two to four Scouts. ***Drivers – Please park around back of the station; don't block the bays.*** All items collected will be distributed to Salem Food Pantries to help needy families in Salem. Neither rain, nor sleet, nor snow will stop this important activity. Please dress properly for the weather. Wear your Troop T-shirt and comfortable footwear. If you need Service Project Hours, this is an ideal chance to earn several hours. If you can't be there for both Saturdays; how about being there for one? Preferably, Saturday the 14th.

VETERANS' DAY CEREMONY

On Tuesday November 11th, as we have done for many years, we will provide a Color Guard at the Veterans' Day Memorial Ceremony at the Salem Veterans Memorial in the Pine Grove Cemetery.
